# **ENGLISH:**

#### **ENGINEERING CAREERS:**

- Gain a deeper understanding of the engineering profession through a personal choice of career plan, backed up by documentary research and interviews.
- General presentation of the module
- Once the research topics have been chosen, the students are put into teams of 3 to 5 for the work to be carried out.
- Documentary research and interviews
- Summary report

#### **INDIVIDUAL COMMUNICATION:**

- CV and covering letter
- Targeting companies and contacts
- Conducting recruitment interviews
- The network and network maintenance
- Individual Communication

#### **HEALTH AND SAFETY AT WORK:**

- Definition of essential concepts, legislation and types of risks encountered (examples of SDSs)
- Identifying the bodies and players involved in prevention and the role of the safety officer in the company
- Definition and example of application of the single document
- Introduction to prevention tools and methods
- Assessing and ranking risks and prioritising preventive actions and measures to be implemented in a work situation

- Invent and implement new physical, sporting and artistic activities.

- Conferences planned (3h CM): History of the creation of sports practices and events, Decathlon R&D innovations, President of the Parkour Federation
- Examples of physical sports and artistic activities that can be used as a support: Derivative activities

## **INTERCULTURALITY**

- Become aware of the negative impact that unintentional bias can have,
- Learn reflexive strategies for identifying and deconstructing them,
- Put the intercultural approach into practice for the first time, using the anti-bias approach,
- Explore their feelings about their next trip abroad,
- Identify the relevant people or resources for this preparation,
- Find out about their destination and identify the biases and stereotypes they might encounter there.
